February Fun Facts.... "The day birds choose their mates"

The February birth flower can be the Iris, which represents faith, hope and wisdom. Or the Violet (Viola), which represents faithfulness, modesty and virtue. The Iris takes its name from the Greek word for a rainbow. The Giardino Del'Iris in Florence, Italy, annually hosts a breeder's competition. The Violet (Viola) has over six-hundred cultivars including shrubs but is usually visualized as the annual bedding plant. One quirk of some Viola is the elusive scent of their flowers; along with terpenes, a major component of the scent is a ketone compound called ionone, which temporarily desensitizes the receptors of the nose, thus preventing any further scent being detected from the flower until the nerves recover
